INTRODUCTION

The thirtieth edition of our Catalogue presents, inter alia, several changes of interest and import.

The traditional red cover has been abandoned in favour of one of more attractive design and appeal-a point of interest.

As a result of the kind endeavours of Dr L. Abramovitch of Sydney, and aided by perusal of the material of the late Chas O. Dunn, the high-value bi-coloured Kangaroo issues have been revised completely. Whilst the editor regrets the necessity to alter catalogue numbering, etc., it is felt the amendments herein, generally, will be favourably received—a point of import.

In our last two editions the editor remarked upon the hardening market, the increasing scarcity of better items, and the law of supply and demand. An upward trend still continues, but whereas post 1937 issues broadly speaking, have stabilised to some extent, the Kangaroo and George V issues, particularly in mint condition, are commanding higher prices as the advances in this edition indicate—a point of interest and import.
